**Re:** COM Mission Statement

As the Mission Review Taskforce, we offer the following <u>revised</u> College of Marin Mission Statement for your review and recommendations. Revisions were made based on survey feedback received from the College Council, each of your Senates, the Planning and Resource Allocation Committee and the Educational Planning Committee. The majority (75%) agreed that the current mission statement reflects the college's purpose. Even so, approximately half offered comments and suggested changes. Many of these involved re-wording. Consequently, we revised the mission statement with the intention of keeping the existing content and most of the original language, altering it to eliminate redundancy, use current terminology and create clarity and simplicity. In addition, we addressed the issue of degrees and certificates, student success and attempted to use more global than program-specific terminology.

As specified in the Integrated Planning Manual mission review process, we are requesting that you review this proposed revision, share it with your constituents and provide us with your approval and/or recommendations. The College Council will then approve or revise the proposed mission, circulate any additional revisions to the college community, then forward to the Board of Trustees for approval.
