- lifelong learning and community and cultural enrichment



Cop's Corner: Receive Emergency Alert Notifications from COM Connect

Last fall the College implemented COM Connect to send emergency notifications to students, faculty, and staff. Using COM Connect, in the event of an emergency or campus closure, Campus Police and College officials can broadcast messages via voice, email, and text (SMS) messages, as well as se to TTY/TDD devices for individuals who are hearing impaired.

Current student, faculty, and staff contact information is automatically included in the system. However, to ensure that the College has your correct email and phone number, please take a moment to review your information by logging on to the COM Connect Portal now and click Sign Me Up. You will be asked to enter the identification code that has been provided to you to find your associated contact. **This code is your M00#.**


Users with call blocking services should add (415) 485-9455 to their approved number list to ensure they receive important notifications from the College.



Ayris Hatton Drawings and Paintings at Emeritus Center


