COM Mission and Planning Update

Every three years, COM reviews its mission statement and develops a new three-year Strategic Plan based on its 10-year Educational Master Plan. The mission statement has been circulated, revised, and will be sent to the Board of Trustees for approval in April. The revised text is below for your reference.

Revised Mission Statement

College of Marin's commitment to educational excellence is rooted in providing equitable opportunities and fostering success for all members of our diverse community by offering:

- preparation for transfer to four-year colleges and universities
- associate degrees and certificates
- career technical education
- basic skills improvement
- English as a second language
- lifelong learning
- community and cultural enrichment

College of Marin responds to community needs by offering student-centered programs and services in a supportive, innovative learning environment that promotes social and environmental responsibility.

Now, the Strategic Plan Task Force is drafting the next three-year plan for feedback from the College community and ultimately approval by the Board of Trustees later this spring.
