
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

Description. The Library Tutorial is a 45-minute introduction to doing research using College of Marin Library's main search tool, SuperSearch. The tutorial was implemented in August 2020. Between then and December 2022 the quiz had been completed by 556 students over the course of 5 semesters, for an average of 111 students per semester. The purpose of the quiz is to review the tutorial's content and to ensure that students complete the tutorial. The quiz can be attempted 3 times and is meant to be fairly easy. Virtually everyone who took the quiz eventually passed it.

Reflections:

- Most of the participants are ENGL 150 students.
- I'd like to know about demographics of the 46 (8%) of students who logged in but did not take the quiz. I'm also curious why they didn't finish.

- I'd like to figure out ways to encourage more instructors across many disciplines to require the tutorial. Only a tiny number of students, approximately 2, have done the tutorial voluntarily.
- It would be useful to get input from instructors about why they don't require it. I imagine a big part of the answer is a lack of publicity. It's hard to spread the word about the tutorial. Maybe I could present it at department meetings
- Some instructors were requiring their students to take the tutorial but stopped. I wonder why. It's hard to ask them without putting them on the spot, but I could try to frame it in an inviting way.
