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## **DEMONSTRATING NEED**

## **CONTEXT & RATIONALE**

- 1. The Fire Tech courses (EMR & EMT) have demonstrated tremendous viability and supported direct connections to employment, continued training, and wage increases.
- 2. Presently there is no Public Safety degree at COM or in the region.
- 3. With emergency medical services, public service sectors, healthcare industries are booming (demand for training, workers, and pathway expansion is all up), a new opportunity to provide a public safety degree will support career and education advancement.
- 4. Our community partners, high schools, industry and advisory groups have asked us to develop and offer a Public Safety Degree.

# **DEMONSTRATING DEMAND**

- -Student inquiries (multiple per semester)
  - -What degree can I get?
- -Current enrollment consistently at or just below capacity
  - -Fire 215 EMR 25/25
  - -Fire 112 EMT 20/25
- -Labor market data shows growth in all public safety areas.
- -Advisory committee, local fire and EMS agency feedback
- -Since 2017 advisory has been asking for a Public Safety Degree to allow existing employees to advance their degrees for promotion and incoming to receive degrees before employment.
- -Currently fire services allows for 9mos paid leave for degree completion, where employees travel to southern California
- -April 28, 2021 Marin IJ article-Chief Weber shares Marin County Fire's Diversity program and their efforts to diversify the industry.



# ADDRESSING RACISM & INEQUALITY IN HEALTH CARE INDUSTRY

- -Marin County Fire to "institutionalize a community driven wildfire prevention program that supports underserved, underrepresented and underfunded young adults in and around Marin County"
- -Novato dual enrollment EMR course increases diversity pipeline
  - -56% of Juniors are BIPOC, 56% of Seniors BIPOC
- -COM's board of trustees just approved the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) plan for COM where we will be focusing on anti-racist work and diversifying students, faculty and staff.

# WHY A PUBLIC SAFETY DEGREE?

#### Value to the student:

- 1. Obtain a degree focused in their field of interest
- 2. Competitive advantage for employment entry and career advancement
- 3. Diverse options of industry entry points

#### Why it's important to implement

For students to have a more focused and easily obtainable degree in the field they will be working in and opportunities for salary increases and promotion.

#### **Diversity**

This degree will appeal to a variety of allied health (EMT, paramedic, fire, medical assisting, non-stem math) students who may normally not pursue a degree, who only complete certification courses to obtain employability. This degree offers employability and career advancement.





#### IS THIS DISTINCTIVE VS. DUPLICATIVE?

### THIS IS A DISTINCTIVE DEGREE

SRJC's health related associate degrees

- **1. Fire Technology:** fire focus, has SIX required courses and no opportunity for EMS, Public Safety, or other allied health focuses
- **2. Company Officer:** must have obtained a State Fire Training Firefighter II certificate--no opportunity for EMS, Public Safety or other allied health focuses.
- **3. Public Health Sciences:** 34 units in the core requirements and no opportunity for EMS, Public Safety or other allied health focuses.
- **4. Pre-Allied Health:** 24 units in the core requirements, intended for Nursing, Physical Therapy Assistant and Dental Hygiene, no opportunity for EMS, Public Safety or other allied health focuses.
- **5. Paramedic**: specific to SRJC paramedic program, no opportunity for Fire, Public Safety or other allied health focuses.

## **FIREFIGHTERS**

- In 2019, the Median Annual salary was \$94,297
- Expect an estimated increase in job availability of 4.0% with an increase of 307 jobs by 2024
- Average Annual Job Openings is 616
- Advisory Committee stated: Currently a firefighter paramedic can make \$108,000 -\$200,000 not including benefits.
- Additional Job Titles for this Occupation: Fire Engineer, Fire Equipment Operator, Fire Rescue Technician, Fire Technician, Forest Fire Suppression Specialist, Forestry Fire Tech, Hot Shot, Wild Land Firefighter

## **EMT AND PARAMEDICS**

- COM Advisory reports \$60,000- \$108,000/yr
- Expect an estimated increase in job availability of 3% with an increase of 189 jobs by 2024
- Average Annual Job Openings is 412
- Additional Job Titles for this Occupation: first responder, flight paramedic
- For North Bay Counties, expect a 12% increase in jobs by 2024.
