General Information

- 1. Should you elect to use the IGETC, it is recommended that after your completion, have it certified in its entirety by the last Community College attended prior to transfer. A full certification indicates that all lower division GE requirements for UC or CSU have been met.
- 2. IGETC certification requires completion of all requirements passed with a minimum grade of C prior to transfer.
- 3. Partial certification is defined as completing all but two (2) courses on the IGETC pattern. Partial certifications must be accompanied by a separate IGETC certification form, which clearly indicates that the certification is "partial," and identifies which requirements remain to be completed.
- 4. In the UC system, some majors do not accept the IGETC as complete fulfillment of lower division general education breath. Please visit a counselor to determine the best education plan depending on your major or field of interest.
- 5. IGETC certification is not a requirement for admission to most UCs and CSUs, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower-division requirement. Please consult with a College of Marin counselor and use www.assist.org for the specific lower-division requirements that are needed to fulfill your educational objective.
- 6. Please request certification when requesting the last transcript from College of Marin prior to entering the UC or CSU system.
