In June 2013 Trustees heard a presentation by Anne Mathieson from the Marin Community Foundation about Marin Promise, a collaborative partnership focused on educational excellence and equity for all children in Marin County. The presentation explained the purpose and intent of the partnership, its structure, implementation phases and anticipated outcomes. The College of Marin will have an important impact working with K-12 partners to mold children's education and prepare them for college. Trustees expressed their support of participating in this important partnership. An agreement defining the intentions and expectations of Marin Promise Partners was approved by the Board in November 2013.

The 2015-16 Marin Partnership goals are as follows:

- 1. Executed short-term strategies to move the needle on the College Readiness and College Enrollment Milestones.
- 2. Reported on our progress toward the cradle to career milestones
- 3. Facilitated the collection and connection of program data on the strategies for College Readiness and College Enrollment
- 4. Expanded the Partnership's public presence and accountability
- 5. Engaged a diverse, inclusive and aligned Partnership Council that is well positioned to advocate for educational equity
- 6. Established a plan for Backbone sustainability
- 7. Completed a plan for launching and/or engaging additional Action Teams and agreed to launch or engage at least one additional team focused on another milestone.

Subject 6. MOU with University of Phoenix Nursing - COM RN Collaborative Baccalaureate of

Science Degree in Nursing - Awarded by University of Phoenix

The College of Marin/University of Phoenix Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing Collaborative will address access and employment issues imposed on our students due to capacity limitations in the California State University system and preferential hiring practices in nursing. The existing Sonoma State University (SSU) collaborative program selects 11 College of Marin (COM) students from a total class of 43 each year. At the same time, employment preference for a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree (BSN) has continued to be more pronounced with decreased employment opportunities for Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) graduates.

The College of Marin/University of Phoenix Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing Collaborative will be implemented in summer 2016 as a concurrent program to the COM Registered Nursing curriculum. Students will complete their BSN through the University of Phoenix at least six months sooner than through the existing collaborative program with SSU, with minimal differentiation in cost and through a nursing program that is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). As an additional option for students, to the SSU collaborative, COM will be able to inform our community and affiliates that our students are dually enrolled in both an ADN and a BSN Program. This message will afford improved opportunities for student employment, and the development of Academic Practice Partnerships that will enhance the role of College of Marin in the community.

This agreement was reviewed by the Law Firm of Liebert, Cassidy and Whitmore.

Action Faculty Entrepreneurship Champion Mini-Grant.

The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Small Business Sector Navigator works with the small business programs of all 113 community colleges across the state. The Small Business Sector Navigator awards Faculty Entrepreneurship Mini-Grants in the amount of \$7,500. A College of Marin instructor was selected by the Small Business Sector Navigator to be Marin's entrepreneurial champion for the 2015-16 fiscal year. The funding will be utilized to research and work with faculty on an Entrepreneurship Certificate (18-25 units) and/or General Business AS degree with Entrepreneurship emphasis and integrate CTE disciplines into the Entrepreneurship Certificate

Other outcomes identified include:

Develop Entrepreneurship Certificate/Degree approved by the COM Curriculum Committee 15 high school students will take dual enrollment in BUS 121 at Novato Unified and/or Terra Linda and/or San Rafael High School.

Develop a pilot countywide "pitch" competition with high school participants and local businesses as judges. Faculty Champion will participate in regional entrepreneur Marketplace events.

Faculty Champion will attend the 2016 Small Business Educator Summit.
